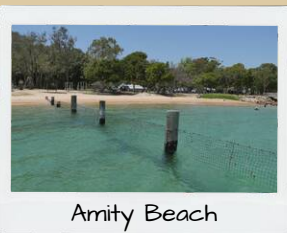


AMITY POINT

Dolphins are commonly seen swimming past Toompany Beach and koalas are often seen chilling in the paperbark forest beside the beach. They also often enjoy a meal and a rest in the gum trees between the beach and the main jetty.

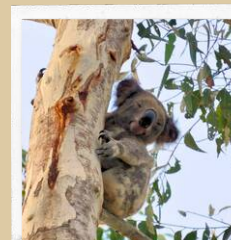

The whale watching season at Point Lookout typically runs from June to November, coinciding with the humpback whales' migration from their feeding grounds in Antarctica to warmer waters in northern Queensland, where they mate and give birth. Visitors can often observe these gentle giants breaching, tail slapping, and performing other playful behaviours

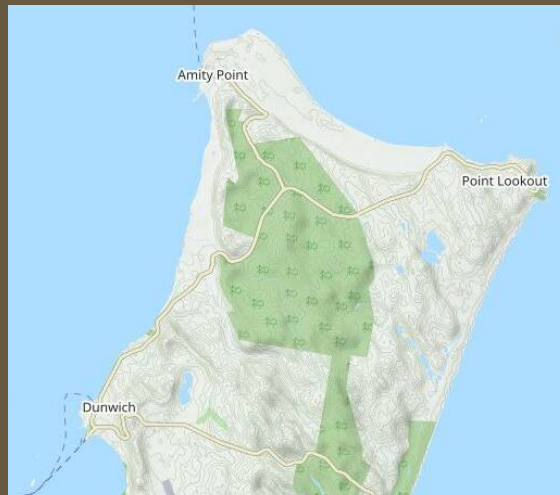
